Robert R. (Roddy) Gabel

Chief, Division of Management Authority, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service

Roddy Gabel has been Chief of the U.S. Management Authority for CITES since January 2007, which means he oversees both the Branch of Permits as well as the Branch of Wildlife Trade and Conservation, which serves as the U.S. CITES policy and coordination office. Prior to moving to the Division of Management Authority, Roddy had been the Chief of the U.S. Scientific Authority, which provides advice on the biological impacts of wildlife trade and listings of species under CITES, among other responsibilities. In addition to CITES responsibilities, the Division of Management Authority has responsibility for issuing permits under several additional laws, including the Endangered Species Act, Wild Bird Conservation Act, Lacey Act, Migratory Bird Treaty Act, Marine Mammal Protection Act, and African Elephant Conservation Act.

Roddy has a B.S. in Animal Science from Cornell University and an M.S. in Avian Physiology from the University of Maryland, and has worked for the Fish and Wildlife Service for 33 years, 21 of which have been in the CITES program. He is also an avid orchid grower, with 1,000 or more plants in his collection, mostly grown under lights. He acquired his first plant, a *Phal. luedde-violacea*, in the late 1970s. He has a particular fondness for *Paphiopedilum* and *Phragmipedium* species and hybrids, and has begun some hybridizing with them. However, he has a varied collection, and recently has developed an interest in *Laelia anceps* and *purpurata* varieties and *Bulbophyllum* species. He has garnered three AOS flower-quality awards, all for *Paphiopedilum* hybrids.


