Tom Mirenda

Tom Mirenda has been the Orchid Collection Specialist at the Smithsonian Institution for the last 10 years. There he cares for and curates an extremely diverse collection of orchid species and hybrids from all over the world. His position includes developing and producing huge educational exhibits using the collection plants that last up to 4 months. And visited by hundreds of thousands of visitors.

Trained originally as a Marine Biologist, Tom made the switch to plants and orchids in his late 20s while living in Hawaii. Since then he has worked with orchids at NY Botanical Garden, Brooklyn Botanic Garden and an extensive private collection at Greentree Estate in Long Island. Tom was also the floor manager at the New York International orchid Show for many years during this period. For the last 6 years. Tom has contributed two columns each month for ORCHIDs magazine and is developing a new book based on those writings. Tom travels frequently around the US and internationally, making presentations to diverse audiences, from scientists to the general public, about orchid ecology, pollination biology, strategies for orchid conservation. He is passionate about seeking collaboration between the worlds of Botanic Gardens, the hobbyist community, commercial growers and scientists to work together toward the goal of protecting orchids and their habitats. Currently working on a project to coordinate and centralize North American orchid conservation efforts. Tom hopes to extend the influence to other parts of the world where orchids are imperiled.

\$50,000 for Orchid Research



Please note, however, that submitting the idea to the AOS does not qualify for any of the research grant. The grants will be disbursed only to established research institutions.

Bert Consentino Recipient of the Orchid Digest Award

Bert Consentino is a founding member of the NH Orchid Society, active since its inception. He has quietly, consistently, and willingly participated in NHOS activities by attending several meetings each year, helping wherever needed at shows since the beginning in the early 90's when shows were held in Manchester, supporting picnic and meeting food offerings, and by often providing plants for "away" displays as well as monthly show tables. He clerks at ribbon judging, and pitches in when a call for help is made—Bert volunteered early on, to produce the newsletter, and did so for many years before job demands required he step down from that role (Ovid and Jean took over for several years). A few years ago, when the need for another editor arose, Bert again stepped up and has been faithfully producing it since. Bert is a good friend to the Society and to the people in it. Bert grows orchids in his greenhouse attached to his home in Manchester, and is an avid gardener as well. 
