For Love of Orchids

It's like taking a floral tour of the world.

In the hothouse at Mason Hollow nursery, there are orchids of every shape, size and color. Some are the size of a thumbnail, some even smaller. There are tiny, furling fern-like orchids among the bright and splashy lycastes and cymbidiums. They come from all over the world, from the tropics to cold mountain ranges.

While Mason is a small town, with a population of just under 1,400, it has become a running joke at the N.H. Orchid Society that per capita, little Mason had some of the best orchid growers around, with several residents taking home prizes during the show. Among them were Chuck and Sue Andersen, who turned their love of orchids into a business with Mason Hollow Nursery.

"It gets to be addictive," said Sue Andersen, of what once was a hobby she inherited from her husband.

Chuck has long been interested in horticulture, he explained, having got his first job in a greenhouse at age 14.

"I was intrigued that orchids grew a little bit different than the other plants," said Chuck. "And the variety was interesting."

While the Anderson's collection ranges the whole gamut of **orchid** offerings, other lovers of the plant have their preferences. For John Crooker of Mason, it's the big, showy flowers that he loves to fill his greenhouse with. With the light floral scent of the orchids, and the classical music he pipes into the greenhouse 24 hours a day, his greenhouse is his favorite place to relax, said Crooker in an interview in his greenhouse on Monday.



"It's a place where you come to relax. It's a place you meditate. It's not a workplace," said Crooker. **Orchid** growing is a hobby that draws you in, said Crooker. He started 15 years ago with a single plant purchased from House by the Side of the Road in Wilton. But soon, he began exploring the many varieties, and was amazed by the large, colorful flowers he could produce, and before he knew it, his hobby had outgrown his house, and he had to build a greenhouse.

"I specialize in and am known for the large orchids," said Crooker. "I like the ones that bloom big."

On the other end of the spectrum sits Ann Chepjian of Mason. Chepjian specializes in the small orchids which are mounted on sticks. At 77, they're easier for her to move from her greenhouse to area orchid shows, explained Chepjian. Having started her hobby only after she retired, Chepjian was quick to pick it up, and now has a thriving collection of 880 flowers — she knows, since as a former librarian, she keeps a careful catalog of all her orchids and their details like blooming cycles and which plants need to be re-potted



"You either go at it with a vengeance and passion, or you're just a hobbyist," said Chepjian. "I went at it with a vengeance,"

Variety is something orchids have no shortage of. In the Anderson's greenhouse alone, there are about 2,000 varieties. Some the average layperson would never guess was an orchid. Some even the most novice of growers could probably put a name to. But each one is special.

"Sometimes all that's left of these flowers is the orchids in people's private collections," said Chuck.
