

AOS Members Meeting, Apopka, Florida by Jean Stefanik, Affiliated Rep

I recently attended the AOS Members Meeting, held in conjunction with the Slipper Orchid Alliance gathering in Apopka, Florida, just northwest of Orlando, from October 30 - November 4th. It was a great gathering of about 200 people, in a nice location, Highland Manor, complete with AOS judging and lots of vendors, both local and some from afar, including international. Speakers included Harold Koopowitz, Jason Fischer, among others.

AOS conducted many Committee and Board meetings... here are some of the highlights (in no particular order) which may be of interest:

After a spectacular huge special issue on Cymbidiums which was recently published, and garnering much positive feedback, it was announced that Oncidinae will be subject of the next special issue.

After a few years of decline, the AOS now has 10,100 member's and the numbers are growing, Initiatives including modifications in renewal procedures, and reminders to lapsed members has made a positive difference.

Still settling in at Fairchild, the AOS headquarters is looking at restoring it's archive library, with reconstruction and remodeling of available space. They would love to have volunteers, perhaps a retired librarian, help in those efforts to make their resources more available to the public. Also, there's an open air courtyard and it was discussed that perhaps it could become an orchid display area with various orchid societies assisting with maintenance.

Check out some new features... the virtual orchid society in Caribbean, AOS Facebook page. Volunteers welcomed in various capacities, check out the speakers list, and webinars are available both online and live, and to be downloaded as backup programs for affiliated societies.

The AOS is financially sound, revenues up, investments doing well, income last year was about 1.5 million, with expenses approximately 900 K.

Contributions are strong... Conservation, technology, judging programs, unrestricted, education, all are appreciated..

The Centennial Celebration is in the early planning stages... more details to come as they develop.

Education efforts have included a continuing series of webinars and a new AOS book by Mary Gerritson and Ron Parsons. In Pennsylvania, there's a new project where kids are given orchid plants, lessons on how to grow them, and then there are special classes for them to be judged at the Philly show.

The Slipper Orchid Alliance project talked about the journal, its format, and membership. They are attempting to populate a collection of slipper orchids in Pennsylvania and are looking for specific plants, crosses, and species. They appreciate donations, of course, but also have a small budget for purchase. I have a paper copy of the wish list... I'll bring it to an upcoming meeting, or contact me if you would like specifics.

AOS Publications Committee reported they greatly appreciate submissions to the journals to enhance usefulness of journal, they welcome articles big and small. Publishing recent awards has been well received, and they invite all to submit material... they will work with people to refine the article for publication.

Governance Committee reported that the nominating bylaws are overhauled.

Big news from the IT Committee. AOS has begun to invest in a new encyclopedia platform they will call OrchidVision, which will unify and update the current Orchids Plus and many other aspects of orchid history and culture, to be more user friendly and useful to both growers and the judging program. More photos and general information will be included, and will be linked to other information including webinars at some point.

Creative fundraising efforts will include a T-shirt contest to be on internet, auctions, raffle tickets

There are nearly 600 judges in the AOS judging system, with over 1600 awards this year so far. New Student judges were announced, as well as those advancing from Associate Judge to Accredited Judge. Announced Annual awards for the Best of the Best AOS awards were voted upon... look for the winners in an upcoming issue.

AOS produces "Appreciation" certificates which may be requested by affiliates to honor AOS members who have contributed to local societies.

Updates on upcoming WOC events - Taiwan will actually be 2 shows combined (sequentially), which will be huge; then a few years following, Australia.

The next Members' Meeting will be March 20- 24 in San Diego, in conjunction with their fabulous show. Check out the San Diego Orchid Society's website... they have one of the most outstanding Conservation grant programs around... a true model for local efforts making a difference, growing over time.


Also, we have several trophies that need sponsoring, they are \$50.00 each except for the special awards which are a bit more, this cost might be tax deductible on your tax return.
