Native Orchid Field Trip!

The NHOS Conservation and Education Committee is pleased to offer a unique opportunity to NHOS MEMBERS. For years we have partnered with Dr. Peter Faletra at Crossroads Academy supporting and enjoying updates on his exciting work with middle school students dedicated to propagating, conserving, and restoring populations of Cypripedium reginae. This orchid is truly magnificent and Jean Stefanik will be leading a full-day excursion to witness this project firsthand and to see the Showy Lady's Slipper in its native habitat... hopefully in peak bloom!


The field trip is set for Saturday June 22, 2019 (RAIN OR SHINE). We will leave the Manchester NH area at 8 AM, then briefly stop at Exit 2 Rt. 89 Park & Ride, Concord at 8:30 AM, arriving in Lyme NH at approximately 10:00 AM. Efforts will be made to carpool. Those driving from elsewhere can meet us at the Crossroads Academy/NH Academy of Science. The address is 95 Dartmouth College Highway (route 10) Lyme, NH 03768.

From 10 - Noon, Dr. Peter Faletra will explain the project in the LAB, including the intricacies of propagation of seeds of various species of native orchids. We will view some of their experimental gardens and there will be ample time for questions. He may have a few surprises ... The NH Academy of Science lab is on the campus of Crossroads Academy in the Brown Barn which is the first building you will pass by as you enter the campus.

Please bring a bag lunch/snacks and drink so we can enjoy lunch from noon - 12:30, then leave in a caravan to visit Eshqua Bog in Woodstock, Vermont. Parking there IS limited so carpooling is necessary. Travel time is approx. 45 minutes from Lyme. We'll take an easy hike of less than 1/2 mile total on level ground and boardwalks to witness one of the most amazing sites of Cypripedium reginae in northern New England. Jean will narrate a walking tour explaining the difference between a fen (which this is) and a bog (which technically this isn't) and pointing out other orchids and carniverous plants as well. Bring your cameras, bug spray, sunscreen and walking stick if you normally benefit from using one.

We'll leave Eshqua at approximately 3:00 PM and stop at nearby Quechee at the Cabot Cheese Shop (with rest rooms) before heading back to NH around 4pm. At this point, some people may choose to head home. Others may choose to stop at Philbrick Criscenti Bog, just off Route 89 at Exit 12, New London, NH. It takes about 1 hour to enjoy this true quaking bog, with hopefully some Calopogon tuberosus blooming... And another option includes catching a bite to eat at Peter Christians's Tavern nearby in the town of New London before heading home. An amazing, memorable, full day!

Dr. Faletra has asked for an expected head count a week or so before June 22nd so I am asking you to email me (Jean Stefanik, Jeango4it@aol.com) with your intention to join us for the day, your cell phone #, (and any questions) - first emailed, first on the list! I'm going to limit attendance to approximately 20 people, and after that I'll make a waitlist, so please let me know if you are serious about attending!
